

Harbinger Bible Conference Camp Rules & Guidelines

“And whatever you do in word or deed, do all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks through Him to God the Father.” Colossians 3:17

- No use of recreational drugs or tobacco allowed anywhere on the grounds
- Modest dress is required when on the grounds
- Children need to be supervised by their parent or guardian.
- Children under 18 must be in the care of a parent, legal guardian or responsible adult who is attending activities on the conference grounds. Children in the care of a responsible adult, who is not their parent or legal guardian should have a medical permission slip. See website for one www.Harbingerbibleconference.org
- Please keep the noise down, as this is a retreat, and quiet time is strongly encouraged
- We encourage you to not bring any animals onto the grounds, owners who do bring pets are responsible to follow these rules
 - Pick up after your dog, using a small plastic bag and properly dispose of it in appropriate trash containers
 - Supervise your dog around other visitors, dogs and children
 - Dogs are to be kept on a leash, tied up or in a crate
 - Please keep your dog quiet, frequent barking disturbs others
 - Dogs should not be in the common buildings, which includes the guest rooms and tabernacle. Service animals are the exception to this rule
 - The Board may ask an owner to remove an animal from the grounds if it is a nuisance or threat to others
- Unmarried couples will be required to sleep in separate rooms for the duration of your stay on the grounds.
- All regular trash needs to be deposited in the dining room trash can, or placed in the dumpster in a sealed plastic bag
- We expect everyone to leave your campsite or lodging facility neat and at least clean or cleaner than when you arrived
- Anyone using campers, rooms or cottages must notify the Camp Administrators by calling 603-837-3377 prior to arrival
- Trailers, RV's and other camping recreational vehicles left on the grounds must be kept in road worthy condition. It is also expected that those who leave these types of vehicles on the grounds will be attending the rallies regularly, or they may be asked to remove it. The Board reserves the right to move privately owned vehicles left on the grounds if it is deemed necessary after an attempt has been made to contact the owner to move it. It is also the right of the Board to require that owners remove their property from the grounds should they determine that it is not being kept in good repair, those using campers should help pay for use of electricity, use is approximately \$5 per day.
- We keep Harbinger Bible Conference active for those interested in participating in the services, activities, rallies and events that occur here. Everyone attending Harbinger rallies is expected to regularly attend the services and activities scheduled throughout the day.
